**V1 XXXIII Plenary Meeting in Chile celebrating CASIC's 25th Anniversary.** Face-to-face meeting in Santiago de Chile with more than one hundred participants, promoting strategic dialogue between chambers and affiliated companies. With the participation of key authorities in health, sustainability, and trade, such as SUBREI, SERNAC, ISP, CNC, MINSAL and DIPOL. CASIC marked its 25th anniversary of contributions to the development of the industry in LATAM.

**OZ** Sector Training: Five online seminars with more than four hundred participants, and a Virtual Week, with five conferences and panels that reached more than 440 participants. These activities promoted the alignment of best practices on trending topics, consolidating CASIC as a strategic ally in regulatory convergence.
